DEL PARKINSON

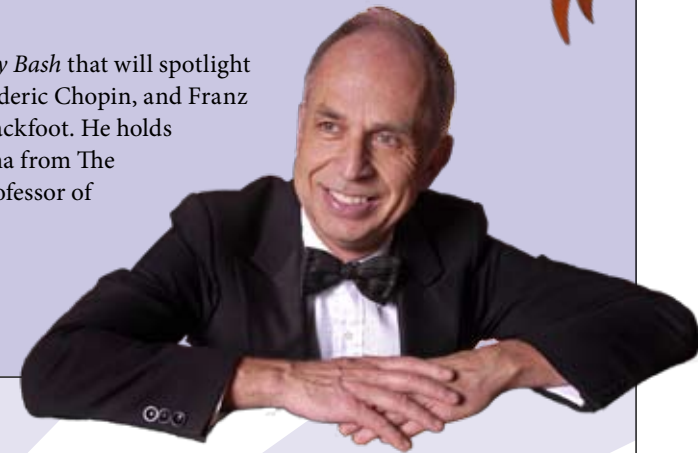
SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 19

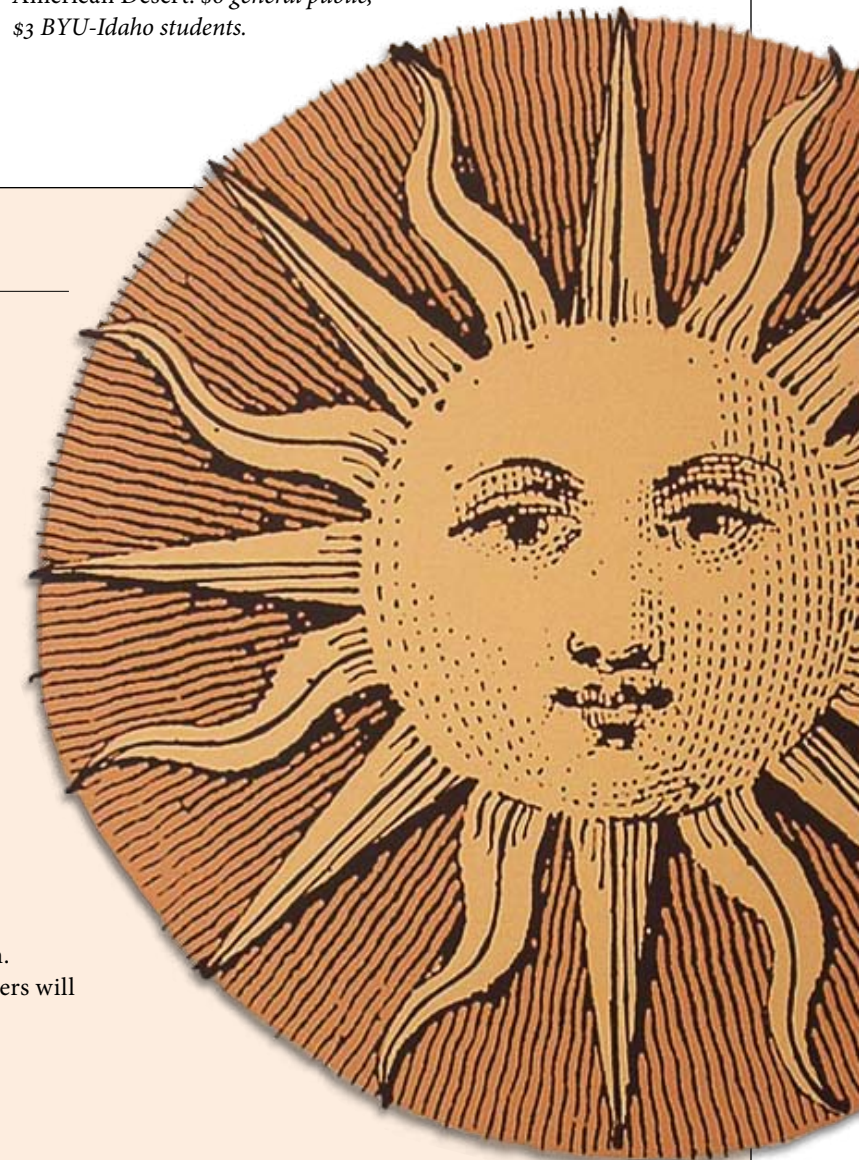
